

## Tensions Mount as Pro-Life Campaign Comes To Sharonville, OH

*Amidst a great amount of controversy in the Greater Cincinnati area over the arrival of well-known abortionist Martin Haskell's abortion facility in Sharonville, a 40 Days for Life campaign begins.*

Cincinnati, Oct 25, 2011 -- The Women's Med Center, operated by Martin Haskell, a late-term abortionist known nationwide for his partial-birth abortion technique, moved his Cincinnati location to Sharonville, a suburb of Cincinnati, last year. Since that time controversy has erupted in the local community and Greater Cincinnati as residents realized that the generic-looking medical building set in a secluded area off of Lebanon Rd. in Sharonville was an abortion facility.

Haskell and his associates are now being met with a 40 day long, constant reminder of the opposition to the clinic. This fall, September 28 - November 6, members of the local community are taking part in a national pro-life campaign, 40 Days for Life. Multiple local churches and individuals are taking part in what is described by the group as "a community-based, interdenominational campaign that draws attention to the atrocity of abortion".

The campaign has not gone unnoticed by the Women's Med Center. Records indicate that law enforcement has been called to the clinic by its staff. There were no arrests as it was determined by Sharonville Police that no laws had been violated.

The nation-wide campaign occurs during the fall and spring of each year so only time will tell the full impact that it will have on Haskell's abortion clinic.
